(OMAHA, Nebr.) The Rose Theater is pleased to announce the cast of its upcoming production, *Babe the Sheep Pig*, playing September 8-24, 2017. The show is being directed by Rose Artistic Director Matthew Gutschick.

Based on the novel that inspired the Oscar-winning movie, *Babe The Sheep Pig* tells a thrilling tale about sharing one's gifts with the world. When a tiny piglet arrives at the Hogget Farm, he is mentored by a wise dog named Fly who shares the secrets of sheepherding with the young pig. Babe soon learns that, to his and to Farmer Hogget's amazement, he has a unique gift for gently herding sheep. When Babe has the opportunity to compete at the Grand Challenge Sheep Dog Trials, he has to muster the courage to be the pig he is destined to be -- despite what others may say.

The title role of Babe will be played by Mallory Vallier, who was last seen at The Rose in the 2016 production of *Shrek The Musical*. Vallier's other stage credits include Sherrie in *Rock of Ages* at the Omaha Community Playhouse (Bill Bailey Debut Award), Heather McNamara in *Heathers* at the Bluebarn Theater (TAG Award - Best Ensemble), Iola Morton in *The Secret of the Old Queen: A Hardy Boys Musical Adventure* and various roles in *RENT*, both at SNAP!. Outside of performing, Mallory is a substitute teacher for various school districts in the Omaha area.

Miriam Gutierrez (who played the title role in The Rose's 2016 production of *Charlotte's Web* and Mrs. Who in the 2014 production of *A Wrinkle in Time*) will play the wise sheepdog, Fly, who mentors Babe and helps her learn the secrets of sheepherding. Other Rose credits include Ama/Enrique in *Tomas and the Library Lady*, and the Cat in *If You Give a Cat a Cupcake*. Gutierrez has thrice been a part of three casts, including Naomi lizuka's *Polaroid Stories* (director Jon Jory), Michael Bigelow Dixon and Val Smith's *The League of Semi-Superheroes*, and in the title role of Gary Kirkham's *Queen Milli of Galt*. She holds a Master of Fine Arts in Acting from University of Cincinnati and has worked in theater in the U.S. and Canada. Her movie credits include working on *The Perfect Score* as Scarlett Johansson's stand-in, *Scooby Doo 2* as Velma's photo double, and as a gauze-eyed patient in *Freddy Vs. Jason*. Currently, Gutierrez is working on her third series of podcasts for discerninghearts.com and preparing to direct *Amahl and the Night Visitors* for the newly founded Nebraska Opera Project.

Robby Stone and Robyn Helwig play Farmer Hogget and Mrs. Hogget, respectively. Robby is a well-known talent on The Rose stage. Stone's resume at The Rose includes *Shrek The Musical* as Shrek, *Big Nate* as Nate Wright, *Jackie and Me* as Joey Stoshack, *Cat in the Hat* as The Boy, *Peter and the Starcatcher* as Mack, and more. Robyn Helwig is a teaching artist at The Rose. Born and raised on the west coast, Helwig received her BA in Theater Arts from the University of Puget Sound in Tacoma, WA. While in Nebraska she has designed for for *Revelation and Neighbors*, *Lovers* and *All the Others* at Shelterbelt, *Bent* at Snap! and *Much Ado About Nothing* at Bellevue Little Theatre. Most recently she has been seen onstage in *Thumbelina* at The Rose, *1776* at the Omaha Community Playhouse and with her improv team at the Backline Comedy Club.

Rounding out the cast are JJ Davis, Jessic Burril-Loge, Kim Clark Kaczmarek, Chloe Langford and Hayley Greenstreet, who play a variety of characters and creatures who inhabit the barnyard world of *Babe the Sheep Pig*.

While not a musical, Adam Sherrerd provides a soundtrack of original and folk music to accompany the play. Sherrerd composes and performs music throughout the Omaha area. He has composed and performed original music for several productions at The Rose, including last season's production of *Thumbelina*.

Babe is being directed by Rose Artistic Director Matthew Gutschick. Gutshick has directed a number of shows at The Rose, including the world premiere of *Prancer*, Disney's *The Little Mermaid*, Disney's *Mary Poppins*, Greg Banks's *Robin Hood, Ramona Quimby*, and *Christmas Story: The Musical*. Under Gutshick's direction, The Rose has developed classes and productions for Pre-K audiences. He has also been instrumental in the commission, production and presentation of ground-breaking new works including *Palette of Possibility*, The Rose's first show developed specifically for youth with autism. The Rose's residency with Daniel Beaty has radically altered the company's approach to outreach, with programs focused on gang violence, teen pregnancy, and youth incarceration. Gutschick is a graduate of the School at Steppenwolf, member of Lincoln Center Directors Lab, and holds a BA from Wake Forest University. He earned an MFA in Theater Management from the Yale School of Drama. He is a current TYA/USA Board Member.

Babe the Sheep Pig runs September 8-24, 2017, with performances on Fridays at 7 pm, Saturdays at 2 pm and 5 pm, and Sundays at 2 pm. The 2 pm show on Saturday, September 16 will be interpreted for people who are deaf or hard of hearing; this show will also include audio description services for audience members who are blind. The 5 pm show on Saturday, September 16 is designated as sensory-friendly, with special accommodations made for families attending with a child on the autism spectrum.
