Elf cast spreads Christmas cheer by singing loud for all to hear

Rose Theater announces cast, adds performances for Elf the Musical

(OMAHA, Nebr.) Bringing Christmas cheer to Omaha via The Rose Theater, *Elf the Musical*, a musical based on the cherished holiday film, features a heartwarming story and delightful dancing to bring light to the holiday season. The show will run at The Rose, Nov. 30 through Dec. 23, 2018. Due to popular demand, the theater has added three more performances to the previously announced schedule.

Buddy the Elf constantly finds himself at odds with his colleagues at the North Pole -- and his significant height difference doesn't help matters. When Santa admits that he and the elves found Buddy after he mistakenly crawled into his bag of gifts and that Buddy is actually a human being, Buddy decides to head off to New York City in search of his father, Walter Hobbs. Faced with the harsh reality that Walter is on the naughty list and his son, Michael, doesn't even believe in Santa, Buddy is determined to win over his birth family and help New York City remember the true meaning of Christmas.

Dan Chevalier plays Buddy. A Rose favorite, Chevalier has been seen in *Wonderland:* Alice's Rock & Roll Adventure, The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, and Honk! the Musical, among several other Rose productions. Zach Kloppenborg adds Santa to his Rose Theater credits, which also include Judy Moody & Stink and Honk! the Musical. Anthony Clark-Kaczmarek returns to The Rose stage as Buddy's father, Walter Hobbs, after directing The Rose's 2017holiday musical, *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*. His wife, Emily Hobbs, will be played by Rose newcomer Melissa King. Rose student Josiah Hydeen plays Buddy's step-brother Michael Hobbs. Hydeen was last seen in The Rose's production of *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*.

In New York, Buddy encounters a wide range of individuals where his unusually upbeat, childlike cheer has a powerful effect on everyone he meets -- with sometimes disastrous results! When he meets Jovie at a department store Santa display, Buddy is truly smitten. Jovie is played by Regina Palmer, an alumnus of The Rose's educational program. Palmer previously performed as Pinocchio in The Rose's production of *Shrek the Musical*.

The cast of *Elf the Musical* features adult and student actors as characters at both the North Pole and New York City. Fourteen students are a part of the cast, ranging in age from 11 to 17 years old. In addition to their roles as elves and various citizens of NYC, at one point during the show, multiple Santas will fill the stage in a musical number. Another highlight of the show will be a depiction of Rockefeller Center, with the ensemble skating live on stage.

Elf is based on the motion picture by the same name, which burst onto the holiday scene in 2003. The fantasy comedy film (directed by Jon Favreau, written by David Berenbaum and produced by New Line Cinema) follows the story of one of Santa's elves who learns he is actually a human and goes to New York City to meet his biological father, spreading Christmas cheer in a world of cynics as he goes. The movie featured an all-star cast including Will Ferrell, James Caan, Zooey Deschanel, Mary Steenburgen, Daniel Tay, Ed Asner, and Bob Newhart. In 2010, the movie was adapted for Broadway, with a score by Matthew Sklar and Chad Beguelin, and book by Bob Martin and Thomas Meehan. The musical ran on Broadway in the Christmas seasons of 2010-11 and 2012–13, and also toured the U.S. in 2012 and 2014. The Rose production marks the first time the show has been produced in the Omaha area.

Elf the Musical is directed by Rose Artistic Director Matthew Gutschick. His original play, Van Gogh & Me, was featured during the previous Rose season. His Rose directing credits include The Meaning of Maggie, Babe the Sheep Pig, The Little Mermaid, Peter & The Starcatcher, A Christmas Story, Mary Poppins, Robin Hood and Ramona Quimby. His plays have been workshopped/produced by Wordsmyth Theatre Company, Horse Trade Theater Group (NYC), Reverie Productions (NYC), Tri Sate Actors' Theatre, and Magic Chicago. His work for MagicMouth Theatre won a New Horizons Playwriting Award and the company premiered a new magic-theatre piece, A Christmas Carol In Prose with Parallel 45 in Traverse City, MI. He is the former artistic director of the Children's Theatre of Winston-Salem and completed a fellowship with the Children's Theatre Company in Minneapolis. Gutschick is a former Managing Director of the Yale Cabaret where he produced over 14 world premieres. He is also the recipient of a Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation Fellowship in Entrepreneurship, a member of the Lincoln Center Directors Lab, and a graduate of the School at Steppenwolf. He holds a BA in Theater from Wake Forest University and received an MFA in Theater Management from the Yale School of Drama. Gutschick is in his sixth season as artistic director of The Rose.
